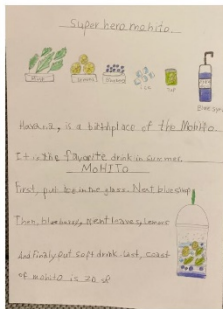
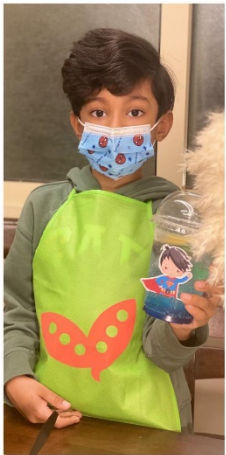
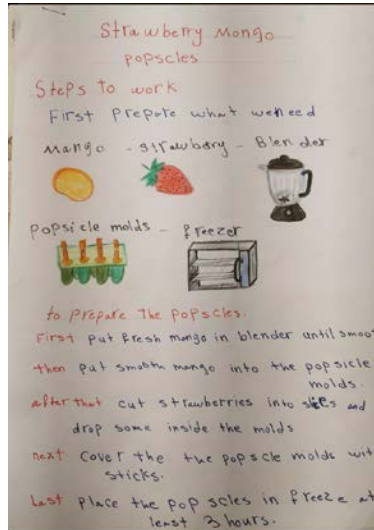

Students were able to identify the concept of bartering and exchange, describes what, where, and how money is used, define money and discuss the uses of it, explain how societies satisfy their basic needs and wants by utilizing capital and natural, manmade, and human resources.

Students were able to differentiate between different kinds of goods and services. They provide examples from daily life of where he/she gets goods and services, thoughts, and even feeling, especially with obese people.
