A TRIP TO SAIHAT PARK



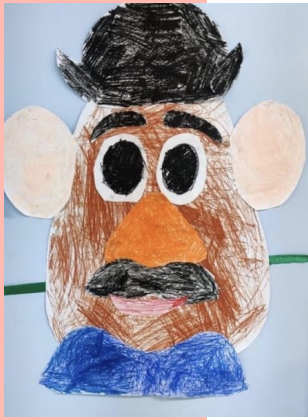
